- New Features at www.healthmap.org -
- (1) Languages: We're now monitoring outbreak news in Spanish, French and Russian. Plus, we've translated the HealthMap interface for each of these languages. Look for Arabic, Chinese and others in 2008!
- (2) Relevance filter: We've developed an automated filtering methodology that groups articles by their relevance and removes non-disease related news from display.
- (3) Duplicate finder: Now all articles on the same outbreak are grouped so that duplicate articles don't overwhelm the user. You can see all articles about an outbreak (and others in the same area) by clicking on the '>>' marker next to an outbreak headline.
- (4) Space and time: We are progressively increasing geographic resolution of the disease map. Some significant developments include administrative areas for Russia, Indonesia and India with more on the way. You can also select specific time periods of outbreaks using our date slider tool (found directly below the map).
